EA Policy for the Accreditation of Certification Bodies Providing Certification of PDO, PGI and TSG *

*** PDO: Protected Designations of Origin
PGI: Protected Geographical Indications
TSG: Traditional Specialities Guaranteed**

PURPOSE

This document outlines the EA policy for national accreditation bodies (NABs) when processing accreditation to certification bodies (CBs) for geographical indications for wine, spirit drinks and agricultural products, as well as traditional specialities guaranteed and optional quality terms for agricultural products according to Regulation (EU) 2024/1143.

It specifies how to use categories for scopes and rules for witnessing for accreditation against EN ISO/IEC 17065.

1 SCOPE

This document is intended to provide and outline the policy for national accreditation bodies undertaking assessment and accreditation of certification bodies seeking to certify PDO's, PGI's and TSG's according to the European regulation related geographical indications for wine, spirit drinks and agricultural products, as well as traditional specialties guaranteed and optional quality terms for agricultural products (Reg. EU 2024/1143).

It provides direction on the formulation of accreditation scopes for PDO/PGI/TSG products based on categories and it outlines details on assessment strategy, number and type of assessment works to be undertaken before accreditation granting and minimum frequencies of assessments for maintenance of accreditation, post granting.

2 ACCREDITATION SCOPE

The scope of accreditation shall be expressed by referring at least to the product categories mentioned in the second column:

2.1 Fixed scope

In case of fixed scope, the accreditation scope shall contain at least the following information:

2.2 Flexible scope

In case of flexible scope, the accreditation scope shall contain at least the following information:

The scope shall be identified as flexible and the way to obtain the detailed list of accredited activities (as per tables above) shall be mentioned, as detailed in EA-2/15.

3 ASSESSMENT PROCESS

3.1 Granting Accreditation

For granting accreditation at least one office assessment and at least one witness assessment per product category (referring to table 1) shall be performed by the NAB.

In exceptional cases, the witness assessment can be postponed as condition to accreditation if business activities inevitably relate to recognition by the national CA.

However, accredited certificates for these scopes can only be issued after the relevant witnessing activities have been concluded favourably and a positive decision is taken by the NAB.

If the result of the witnessing activity postponed is negative, the NAB shall consider reducing the scope of accreditation.

If the evaluation of the product includes testing (sensory or otherwise) performed either by the CB or subcontracted to another body, and if it is not performed under accreditation, NABs shall plan to assess this activity (by witnessing and/or office assessment) for granting accreditation. The assessment/witnessing team shall include competent resources for the assessment of the testing activities.

3.2 Surveillance

During one accreditation cycle, all product categories shall be assessed by witness assessment and file review during office assessments.

If the evaluation of the product includes sensory testing performed either by the CB or subcontracted to another body, and testing is not performed under accreditation, NABs shall plan to assess this activity at least once during the accreditation cycle. The assessment/witnessing team shall include competent resources for the assessment of the testing activities.

3.3 Extension

3.3.1 Fixed Scope

An extension for a new product category requires the successful completion of an on-site witnessing. After accreditation has been granted for a product category, inclusion of other products in the accreditation scope for that category may, if possible, be granted by documental review to assess that the CB possesses the necessary competence to certify the new product(s), and it has at least one client.

3.3.2 Flexible Scope

An extension for a new product category requires one witnessing. After accreditation has been granted for a product category, for the inclusion of other products in the flexible accreditation scope, EA-2/15 applies.
